

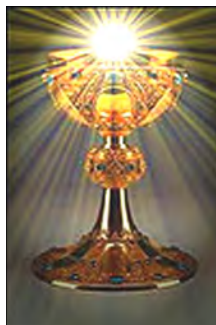

Second Collection

The second collection next weekend May 21st and 22nd is for Ecuador. We thank you in advance for your generosity.

Did You Know?

"I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."

Those words are precious to us. They were first spoken by Jesus to the Apostles (Matthew 28:19) and are repeated at every Baptism. They are said in countless languages the world over, whenever a new soul is claimed for Christ and welcomed into the Church. In many ways, our baptism day is our "birth day," as we are spiritually reborn.

Pentecost is sometimes called the Birthday of the Church. On the first Pentecost, God sent the Holy Spirit dramatically. Through a "baptism" of wind and tongues of fire, many of Christ's followers began to speak in foreign languages so that the Gospel could be heard by all peoples. The Holy Spirit enters us at Baptism and acts as our Counselor, Inspirer and Comforter, confirming in us the things of God and aiding us throughout our lives. It is the Holy Spirit whose presence we celebrate on the Feast of Pentecost. In fact, until 1962 the calendar time between Easter and Advent - now called Ordinary Time - was called "the time after Pentecost."

The Holy Spirit also sends all baptized believers gifts today; unique gifts to be used for the building up of our church community and/or to share the Gospel with others.

Confirmation seals the Promises made at Baptism as the Holy Spirit rests in a special way on all new confirmands. Let's pray for all of the newly confirmed this month and also be grateful for the Bishops, Priests and Deacons who administer the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation.

In addition, let's ask the Holy Spirit of our Living God to renew, inspire and equip us for good works.

Parish Feast Celebration: A Committee has been formed and has specific duties. We will have a Parish Picnic in honor of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel on Saturday, July 16th Her Feast Day. Sunday, July 17 is the *rain date*: Festivities are to commence with the 5:00PM Mass, Sat., with picnic to follow. Access to Burpee Field and Pavilion has been arranged and OLMC school parking lot and gym have been secured for both dates. 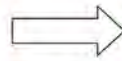

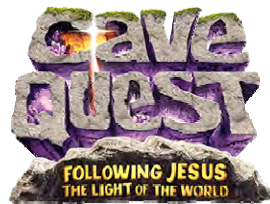

OLMC Act of Mercy for Middle East Refugee Family

As you may know, members of our parish and neighboring parishes recently returned from their pilgrimage to Greece and Turkey, in the footsteps of St. Paul. During our time on this grace filled journey, we had the unexpected gift of being in Greece when Pope Francis came there to pray and show the face of mercy by offering safe homes to three Muslim refugee families who accepted and who came back with him to the Vatican to start their new life in peace.

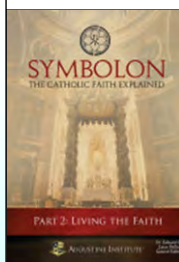
